Special Congregational Meeting

May 18, 2025, Special Congregational Meeting of Christ Lutheran Church.

The meeting was called to Order at 10:00 by President Tami Taysom

Tami handed the meeting off to Pat.

The meeting quorum was certified as there were 49 voting members in attendance.

Pat presented details of the project. He presented the financial details of the quote received from Wisconsota Painting. 5 contractors were contacted. 2 responded and one submitted a quote. He also talked about an alternative method for the exterior of the church. However, he stated that the alternative process would require 4-5 months to go through the quoting, and church approval process. Three questions were asked of the congregation. One, was "do we want to do the project?" There was a unanimous yes hand vote. The second question was "What options do we want to include?" A hand vote was taken on the combination of the main package and the painting of the parsonage. It was decided to decline the 5 year warranty option. A unanimous hand vote was taken for the option package. And finally, it was decided to finance the project through a combination of Capital Fund raising and use of special funds. There was an affirmative vote for the combination financing alternative.

Pat Rohn described the vote would be on a motion that "The church would move forward with the Painting Project, accepting the quote from Wisconsota Painters with the main package and the Parsonage Option, to be funded by a combination of Capital fund raising and special funds monies". Bern Ziegeweid moved and Bill Lockington seconded the motion. The motion passed on a unanimous hand vote of 49-0.

Motion made by Karen Mullikin and seconded by Marv Rodvold to adjourn. The vote passed unanimously

August Blood Drive



The basic shape of our time in Arcadia was influenced by the following...

Arcadia is a beautiful area with hills and valleys – spectacular in spring and fall....... A WONDERFUL GIFT!

The national and world scene was tense – the Vietnam War and Nixon resignation were divisive issues.

The Arcadia community was shaped and divided by the teaching and practice of the Catholic Church – strong opinions were present which affected friendships, families, weddings, etc.

CONGREGATION LIFE WAS BUSY AND BOLD!

Many new materials were published by the Lutheran Church and using those materials involved a steep learning curve. Worship and new study materials for Sunday school, confirmation and adult education provided challenges and great learning for both the pastor and congregation.

BETHEL BIBLE STUDY AND RURAL INTERNSHIP

The congregation chose to use the Bethel Bible program as a way to learn a new approach to Biblical study as well as a way to prepare teachers and encourage wide participation by the membership. This was a new and energizing time for the congregation.

The congregation became a "teaching congregation" by hosting Luther Seminary students who were preparing to serve as pastors. The students were interested in a "rural" setting for this year. Wayne was the supervising pastor and the congregation provided feedback and discussion on the importance of rural issues. Three students completed the one year program and following graduation were called to serve ELCA congregations – Earl Vorpagel, Keith Kolzow, and Gary Lundberg.

YOUTH MINISTRY

Youth ministry was a very active part of the congregation's life – meetings, retreats, conventions (both state and national), camps, and church overnights were well attended by all young people in the community – both Lutheran and Catholic. Wayne has fond memories of the youth and adults involved in the program.

RANDOM MEMORIES

- ONLY IN ARCADIA could there be a hospital owned and operated by an order of German nuns....
 and, for a time, a male, Jewish man was hired as the administrator.
- Wayne, a Lutheran pastor, was elected to the school board and named the Arcadia Friar by friends.
- Cathy was certified to teach Home Economics but substitute taught in almost all classes including ag, shop, etc. and taught community education classes on upholstery and sewing.
- SPECIAL daughter, Lynn, would graduate from Arcadia as class valedictorian a proud Mom and Dad.
- Buicks Wayne traded cars every year Cliff Scharlau was very generous.
- VERY SPECIAL NEIGHBORS and FRIENDS Lizze Ryan, Eldon and Helen Berg, Leonard and Emma Lien, Art and Lydia Schultz. Art was also the General Manager of AG cooperative a great friend and congregation member and Nancy Schultz is a special friend of Cathy.

My Dear Christ Lutheran Church,

I am so sorry I won't be at the 150th Anniversary Celebration on July 27, but will keep you all close in my thoughts and prayers during this joyous occasion, and always.

I can't believe it's been 37 years since I began my very first job out of college as the Youth Director at Christ Lutheran in 1988. It was my first 'real' job, and to this day, remains my favorite. I have so many fond memories of the church, youth activities, the community, and mostly all of you who made up the beautiful church I called home and work for three years. I'm thankful that I still keep in touch with many of you, and hold each and every one of you close in my heart.

I fondly remember youth events, Sunday School, and the live Christmas Nativity scene, which was the very first big event I helped plan when I arrived in the Fall of 1988. I had no clue what I was doing, but with the gracious help and patience of the church and community, things somehow fell into place, including all of the animals. I also remember planning & attending youth gatherings, both locally & nationally, singing in the choir, planning & hosting fundraisers, Wednesday night Lenten soup suppers, the amazing & always supportive youth advisors, and the countless letters I sent out frequently about youth events that drove everyone crazy.

I remember organizing the poinsettia plants at Christmas time and tapping each one gently with a long stick before I watered them just in case a bat or two had found their way into the cozy warmth of those plants during the night, which did happen from time-to-time, as well as the time a bat flew into a church council meeting and I dove under chairs, which caused a loud uproar, but a humorous one.

I am so grateful for the joy, laughter, camaraderie, friendship, and family in Christ that I still share with all of you, even after all of these years, and even when communication doesn't always happen in a timely manner (by me). I am truly grateful.

After leaving Arcadia in 1991, I attended grad school in Milwaukee, graduated in 1993, and shortly thereafter, ended up in New York City. I have called New York home for the last, almost 32 years. Some of that time has been good, and some not so good, just like everything else in life, but I have remained in contact with many of you through it all...God's goodness all around!

I went back to school for my nursing degree in 2000, and do per diem nursing a couple of months out of the year now, and also work for the same company I've been with for 27 years as an instructional design specialist, writing the clinical piece for healthcare companies.

I've been married to my husband, George, a Brooklyn boy born and raised, for over 22 years now., and our son, Joseph will be starting his senior year at the University of Pittsburgh in the

fall, working toward a degree in Physical Therapy. George is a retired FBI agent, who is currently working for a global risk organization that provides security solutions for individuals and organizations around the globe. I very much look forward to retiring, but I'm not there just yet... there is still tuition to pay, after all.

We currently live in Brooklyn with our beloved goldendoodle, Jake, who rules the roost. We also manage to get to our condo in Florida quite a bit, too, especially in the winter. I thank you for the opportunity to touch base again and share some of my fondest memories. I would love to hear from you, and can be reached at the information below.


I hope you all enjoy this wonderful 150th celebration of Christ Lutheran Church, and gratefully look forward to being a beacon of light and faith for the next 150 years.



Congratulations and many blessings to all the members of Christ Lutheran of Arcadia as you celebrate 150 years of proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ.

The time Kathy and I spent in Arcadia was so special.

We were welcomed into Christ Lutheran and the community of Arcadia when it became necessary for us to leave Canada and return to the United States so that we would be close to and care for Kathy's mother who struggled with Alzheimer's

By coming to Wisconsin, Kathy got a chance to reconnect with her college roommate, Bishop April Ulring Larson and I had gift of working in a faith community at Christ Lutheran that enjoyed lively worship and were open to new possibilities. The gift I had working with Kris Knutson in youth ministry and music was invigorating. She was a wonderful partner in ministry. The gift of a projection system enabled an ease in worship. The beginning of Stephen Ministry and the time spent training those very special servant leaders was certainly a highlight of our time in Arcadia.

It became necessary to leave Arcadia with Kathy's mother requiring a deeper level of care and we settled in Onalaska at First Lutheran. Time spent at First Lutheran included a very special moment, the ordination of our daughter Elizabeth (Elly) and her first call to serve the Lutheran Church of Jordan and the Holy Land. She later served as campus pastor at Concordia College, Moorehead, Minnesota. At present she serves a rural Lutheran church near Edmonton, where she resides with her husband, Rob, and their three children, Liam, Benjamin and Keziah. Our son Joshua works as a carpenter and as a very successful jazz bassist also in Edmonton and with his wife Megan have two children, Lucy and Ada. They are active in a United Church of Canada congregation that is very open and welcoming.

Near the end of our time at First Lutheran in Onalaska I began to experience some health issues. At the same time my brother in Texas was experiencing a difficult journey with the health of their son. I took an early retirement and Kathy and I, along with her mother moved to San Antonio, Texas to be closer to my brother. Kathy took a position as a speech pathologist and I became the full time caretaker of Martha, Kathy's mother until her death a year later. After this I was able to walk through a major life issue with the support of Kathy and a gifted counselor, and I finally accepted myself as the person I had been created, and with Kathy's encouragement, came out and embraced my sexuality as a gay person. This was a long and at times painful journey, the but the lend result led to those health issues disappearing and my family welcoming this new chapter in our lives.

At present, we all live in Edmonton, Alberta. Kathy and I are divorced, but remain each other's best friends. We, along with our children and grandchildren gather weekly for family dinner. I have a partner of 9 years, Alberto, who is originally from Mexico and works as a fashion designer. We spend several months each year in Mexico with his family. I have become active again as a pastor and serve as an honorary assistant at the Anglican Parish of Christ Church, Edmonton. I sing in the choir along with Kathy, get to share the peace with three of my grandchildren, Elly and Rob's children as they also worship there two Sundays a month when she is not at her called church. I assist Sue, our rector, preaching, presiding at communion, and taking on other responsibilities as is necessary, and will be coordinating our small group ministry this fall. Our services can be seen weekly on YouTube by searching "The Anglican Parish of Christ Church, Edmonton."

Our time at Christ Lutheran was very meaningful for us and we frequently share memories of our time there with friends and family. Blessings to you as you celebrate your 150th Anniversary. Our time spent there is embedded deeply in our hearts.
