Dear Siblings in Christ,

"How often I have longed to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings." Luke 13:34

In this text, we focus on God's protective love. As a metaphor, God is seen as a Mother Hen. This imagery reveals God's heart—a heart full of love, compassion, longing to protect and shelter His children. Like a mother hen, God offers us safety, comfort, and unconditional love. God gathers us under His wings, shielding us from harm and providing a place of refuge. The character of a mother hen also reminds us of the sacrificial nature of love.

This mirrors Jesus' ultimate sacrifice on the cross, where He gave His life to save us and bring us into His eternal home. Just as a mother hen nurtures and protects her brood, we are called to care for one another, creating a community of love, prayer, support, and faith.

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

President Tami Taysom is calling a congregational meeting for **SUNDAY, May 18TH (AFTER WORSHIP)**. **Order of Business:** Changes to the Constitution & By Laws. This will be the second meeting of the two required congregational meetings and your attendance is very important!

Church Council to complete revisions to the Constitution.

In 2019, Council decided to revised the Church Constitution to bring it up-to-date with the most current ELCA version. The Constitution has not been revised since 1991. ELCA National Synod revises it's constitution every 3 years. The revisions that are proposed are to the 2019 synod revisions.

Unfortunately, about the time that the Constitution Committee completed their work, the 2020 pandemic changed everyone's worship life. Once we were able to get back to the business of running the church, Council decided to restart the constitutional revisions process. The vast majority of the work was completed by Karina O'Brien and her team and was ready for presentation to the congregation.

During the interim, a few more changes have been identified. But, now we are prepared to present the revised constitution to the congregation. Council has set the dates of April 27 and May 18 for congregational meetings to be held to approve the revised constitution. At these meetings, the only item of business will be voting on the proposed revision. A quorum of approximately 30 people will be required to conduct the business of these meeting. So, it is important that you attend.

Copies of the revised constitution will be provided at the back of church in the coming weeks. Most of the revisions are wording changes but do not dramatically affect thee operation of our church. However, there are three important changes that need to be approved. Though they may seem minor, their approval is important to the business of our congregation. They are:

Chapter 12 Item C12.05

This change allows for the maximum contract that the "council may enter into that is not included in the budget" from \$1,000 to \$5,000. This may seem like a large amount.

However, with the increase in costs, if there is a failure of the heating or air conditioning, water heaters. Computers or projectors, or electrical systems, costs can rapidly approach the \$ 5,000. As of right now, Council cannot enter into a contract over \$ 1,000 for these repairs without a congregational meeting which can take up to 3 weeks to schedule.

Bylaws Section II Conflicting Loyalties

Please read this section It has been deleted in the National ELCA constitution. Elimination is self-explanatory. This would include organizations like the Scouts and government programs like food distribution or other outreach programs.

Bylaws Section V Annual Meeting

The Bylaws stipulate that the annual meeting is to be held in January. We are proposing to change this bylaw to allow for the inclusion of February. This allows for the most up-to-date reporting of the church's financial accounts due to the reporting from our banking institutions.

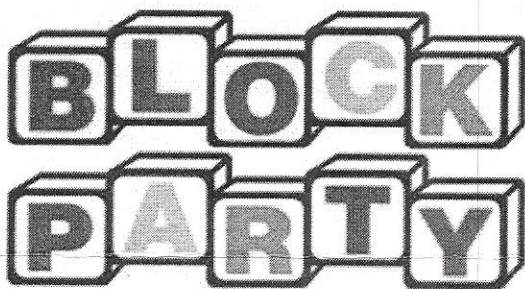
Thank you from the Soup Man (Brad Duellman)...

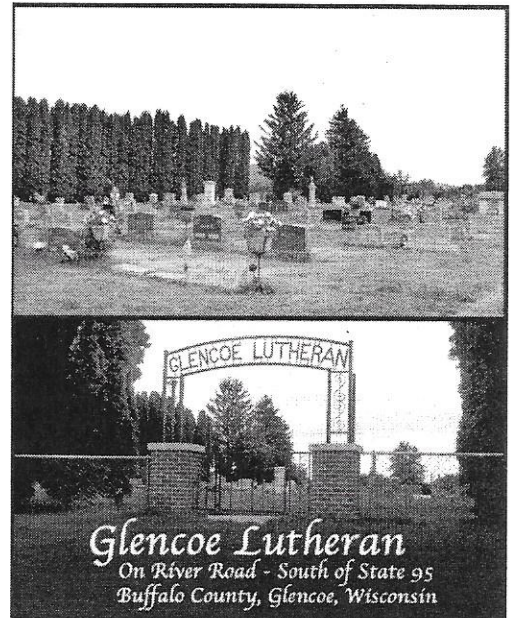
Women's Bible Study

Christ Lutheran has 2 Cemeteries

Glencoe Lutheran Cemetery

Three acres of land was donated on April 12, 1866, by George and Susan Barbara Keller, to be used for a place of worship and a cemetery. This became the site of St. John's Church when it was built in 1875. The church was closed by the early 1930s and was dismantled before 1949. Even after the synodical split among the Arcadia Lutherans, the Glencoe Cemetery continued to be used by both the American synod and the Wisconsin synod churches. Today it is our larger cemetery with more than 1,100 burials.

Montana Lutheran Cemetery

This cemetery is also called the Lower Montana Ridge Cemetery.

The Montana Lutherans signed a constitution in 1875, but they did not have land or a building until some 10 years later. Frederick and Wilhelmina Dorn deeded one and a half acres to the church for the total of two dollars in 1885. A small church was built and continued in use until 1959. Sometime later it was razed. The cemetery is small with a little more than 100 graves.

These two Buffalo County cemeteries mark the foundation of Christ Lutheran Church in Arcadia. It is where we find our roots in the dedicated early Lutherans who secured our place in history. Many of our church founders now lay at rest in these two cemeteries. Christ Lutheran has a proud heritage. Now it is our time to carry on proclaiming the Gospel into the ever changing future.

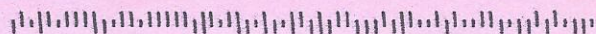
